Provisions of the PhD Course in Archaeology, History and Human Sciences supplementing the University Regulation on PhD Courses in Archaeology, History and Human Sciences

Having regard to the resolution of the PhD Course Board of 15 April 2025, the following provisions are being reorganised and supplemented

1

Publications

From the 38th cycle onwards, doctoral students must publish at least one contribution in a scientific journal, volume or conference proceedings during the three-year period.

2

Online lectures

Starting from the academic year 2024-2025 doctoral students may be authorised by their supervisor to attend lectures remotely in the following cases: in the event that the doctoral student is away from home on an authorised stay in order to work on the thesis; in the event that the doctoral student falls into the category of civil servant without a grant, in view of the distance from the place of employment.

Doctoral students may be authorised by the Course Coordinator to attend lectures remotely in the event of illness.

Doctoral students must send the course lecturer, the supervisor and the PhD Course Coordinator a brief report on the lecture, showing actual participation and involvement.

Stays abroad

Starting with the 41st cycle, PhD students with scholarships must undertake a stay of at least three months, even if not continuous, at foreign public or private institutions, identified in agreement with the supervisor.

Doctoral students may be exempted on formal request addressed to the PhD Course Coordinator, for serious and documented impediments.

Off-site stays in Italy

Starting from the 41st cycle, PhD students with a scholarship must undertake a stay of at least three months, even if not continuous, at public or private institutions located in Italy other than the seat of the PhD course, identified in agreement with the supervisor.

PhD students may be exempted upon formal request addressed to the PhD Course Coordinator, for serious and documented impediments.

Compulsory provision of data

In order to ensure the smooth running of the PhD Course, doctoral students are required to cooperate with the bodies of the PhD Course, which are engaged in the collection and processing of data relating to their scientific and training activities.
