Overall objectives of the mobility:

The general objectives are based on the following general competences: - That students at the three universities have the ability to communicate in foreign languages, which involves, in addition to the same basic competences of communication in the mother tongue, intercultural mediation and understanding. - That students develop digital competence, which entails mastery and safe and critical use of information and communication technologies

(ICT), both for learning (interaction on the virtual work platform) and for research (search for and presentation of digital information). That students have the ability to learn to learn, a competence linked to learning, to the ability to undertake and organise learning either individually or in collaborative groups, depending on the opportunities available.

Added value in the context of the modernisation and internationalisation strategies of the institutions:

Content of the teaching programme:

In the selection of the contents, we have chosen to plan the sequence according to four intentions: significance, consensus on the most relevant contents in the area of pedagogical knowledge, connection with the competences, objectives and expected learning outcomes, as well as contextualisation in the degrees.

Structure: The contents are structured in two blocks:

BLOCK 1: The pedagogical renewal movements. The New School. Anti-authoritarian educational currents. Libertarian and selfmanagement movements. Personalist educational theories. Critical currents.

BLOCK 2: Alternative pedagogies. Montessori schools. Waldorf School. Summerhill. Reggio Emilia. Forest schools. Rural Schools. Slow Education. Homeschooling.
